Off-Campus Access VPN

From the top of the **Chinook** homepage, select **Off-Campus Access VPN**.

To retrieve journal citations (and in some cases full-text articles), click on **Find Articles & More**. From there, select subject areas, or if you know the name of the database, you can select from the A to Z list.

Databases of interest:

- ❖ **Biological Abstracts**
All aspects of biology. 1969–present.
- ❖ **Genetics**
1982–present.
- ❖ **PubMed**
U.S. National Institutes of Health (NIH) free digital archive of biomedical and life sciences journal literature, expanded coverage of the life sciences beyond **Medline**. More than 19 million citations. 1967–present.
- ❖ **PsycINFO**
All aspects of Psychology. 1806–present.
- ❖ **Web of Science or Web of Knowledge**
Interdisciplinary index accessing current and retrospective bibliographic information from over 9,000 scholarly, top-tier, peer-reviewed journals. Coverage 1900–present.
- ❖ **Google Scholar**
Provides access to scholarly books and journals, growing all the time. Still in beta test.

Full-text Databases:

❖ **Science Direct**

Web-based database that searches over 1800 Elsevier journals in science and social science. Access for many (1200 approx.) of the titles held by CU is from 1997 and forward.

❖ **JSTOR- Biological Science Collection**

Archive of full-text articles from ecology, botany, biodiversity, conservation, paleontology, and plant science, in addition to cell biology and zoology. There are over 65 titles under "Ecology and Evolutionary Biology" including: *Evolution*, 1947–2006; *Ecological Monographs*, 1931–present; *Ecology*, 1920–present; *Journal of Ecology*, 1913–present; *Journal of Biogeography*, 1974–2001; *Microbial Ecology*, 1974–2006.

Interlibrary Loan: from Chinook homepage under [Interlibrary Loan](#)

- **ILLiad** – traditional borrowing from other institutions, 2 week or less delivery of copies (paper or electronic) of articles, dissertations, books, etc., are sent at no cost.
- **Prospector** – borrowing from Front Range Libraries, usually 3–5 days.
- **PASCAL** -- (CU's off-site storage facility in Denver), Science journal articles, pre-1980 are available on a 24 hour turn around, scanned copies under 50 pages.

Finding a journal that is NOT online. Use the [Chinook Library Catalog](#). Choose to search by "Title" from the "Search by" drop-down options on the main Chinook page, enter the name of the publication you are looking for, and choose to search in "Journals/Serials." Click on the appropriate title to get information about where the library has that publication, and for which dates, in print. Make sure to note the location and call number of the publication so that you can locate it within the library.

RefWorks is a web-based tool that allows users to create personalized databases of citations from which you can create bibliographies and format papers in hundreds of different citation styles in seconds. CU students, staff and faculty can create a free RefWorks account that will allow access to their personal database from anywhere with an internet connection.
